Provisional Activity Report 2020-2021

Asmee Foundation is a non government organization (NGO) which is dedicated to provide basic education to underprivileged kids under the banner of **Asmee Shiksha Kendra**, who are constrained by resources but their talent and urge to study is by no means constrained, which also reflects in their growth in early days. Simultaneously, Asmee Foundation is also focusing on the grown up kids from humble background, who could not get their elementary education in early age and now are not inclined to elementary education, by giving them skills training under the banner of **Asmee Kaushal Vikas Kendra** like mehendi, stitching, artificial jewelry making (for girls) and mobile repairing, hardware repairing (for boys). Additionally, Asmee Foundation is also creating awareness about various health issues like menstrual hygiene, healthy eyes, oral hygiene among communities at high risk of health issues under the banner of **Asmee Swasthya Sewayein**.

To be able to offer these services, Asmee Foundation is fortunate to have many dedicated volunteers, who come from various walks of life like IT Professionals, Media Professionals, Corporate Professionals, PhDs, MBAs, CAs, Civil Servants, Bankers, Consultants and many others who bring their experiences, expertise, and perspectives to the foundation. What unifies them is the common goal of improving the future of our children and youth of India.

Asmee Foundation's mission is to improve quality of life and outcomes for children in shelters and to ensure that every child is able to fulfill their potential irrespective of his or her circumstances. Hence the name "ASMEE" that stands for the self respect and courage of kids and youth, the foundation is associated with, while they are facing the challenges of life to make it meaningful for themselves and their families.

Our objective is to ensure that these children are able to live a life free from exploitation and are capable of managing emotional and financial life crises.



This year, in order to keep the environment clean and free from plastic, "Say No To Plastic" program was added to the existing programs of Asmee Foundation as mentioned above.

Say No To Plastic Initiatives:

1. Thaila Bank

"Thaila Bank" helps curb the problem of plastic menace and promotes the usage of cloth bags (thaila). The initiative also helps underprivileged women and girls (trainees of Asmee Foundation) to earn their livelihood.



2. Thaila Bank Booth

In order to make "Thaila Bank" known to people especially among street vendors, "Thaila Bank Booths" were organized in various neighborhood like Angel Murcury & Niho Scottish Garden as well as with few vegetable vendors in Indirapuram





3. Save Mother Earth Mission: Support to "My 10 Kg Plastic"

Asmee Foundation in association with IPCA (Indian Pollution Control Association) under My 10kg Plastic initiative is collecting plastic waste weekly from different societies of Indirapuram including Princess Park Society. This disposable plastic material is given to recyclers to make roads, tiles etc. A step that can go a long way in giving better environment to our future generations.



4. Felicitation Ceremony: Plastic Warriors

Asmee Foundation with Support From Indian Pollution Control Association felicitated the Princess Park, Indirapuram, Ghaziabad Plastic Warriors and aware participants from Kanawani Village, who have been leading the efforts of plastic segregation at their respective homes making it an unprecedented initiative which has contributed towards collection of 4,274.8Kg Plastic by 20 Societies of Indirapuram in last 5 months. Let's make it 10,000Kg together in next 5 months.





6. Awareness Session on 'Say No To Plastic'



1. Teaching Underprivileged Kids


